What Calms You?

Even the most serene individuals all had moments in their lives when they searched for ways to calm themselves down. Everyone has something they do which will help them get in touch with that sometimes fleeting peace which comes from unexpected places.

For those of us with a disciplined prayer life (or even an undisciplined one), we all have some sacred space that we can return to. It might be climbing a mountain, relaxing on the beach, a coffee on a Sunday morning. These images, stimulation, and experiences all have a direct connection to God, even though it might not be obvious at the time.
