Dear Faith Family,

We persist in Easter joy!

As you may be aware, Santcon will be held in a Boston Hotel next weekend. We all need to raise our voices in prayer in intercession for our community. Many Catholic and other faith groups are joining in prayer. We especially pray for the convention participants, hotel workers, and Mayor Michelle Wu. Why Mayor Wu? She attempted to

prevent Santcon from coming to Boston and for her efforts the organizers dedicated the gathering to her. She and all of Boston need our prayers.

It is not advisable to go to the convention and protest. Our best response is to pray. On Saturday, April 29th from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM at St. Camillus Church, our faith family will gather in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament to pray for the protection of our community. We will be sharing different forms of prayer including the reading of Scripture, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and spiritual talks or lessons. You can sign-up to commit to a time of prayer via sign-up sheets at the entrance of our churches. Some may choose to pray the Rosary, on the three days of the event, for the conversion of souls and the protection of the Hotel Workers. It is a laudable practice to write down your prayerful commitment and place it in the offertory receptacle next week as you enter the Church. *"This Kind can only be cast out by prayer" (Mk 9:29).*

I am choosing to pray the Guardian Angel Novena starting on Sunday April 23rd and concluding Monday, May 1st.

Guardian Angel Novena

O holy angel, whom God, by the effect of His goodness and His tender regard for my welfare, is charged with the care of my conduct, and who assists me in all my wants, and comforts me in all my afflictions; who supports me when I am discouraged and continually obtains for me new favors, I return thee profound thanks, and I earnestly beseech thee, O most amiable protector, to continue thy charitable care and defense of me against the malignant attacks of all my enemies.

Keep me away from all occasions of sin. Obtain for me the grace of listening attentively to thy holy inspirations and of faithfully putting them into practice. In particular, I implore thee to obtain for me the favors which I ask for in this novena.

Protect me in all the temptations and trials of this life, but more especially at the hour of my death, and do not leave me until thou has delivered me into the presence of my Creator in the mansions of everlasting happiness. Amen.

The clergy, lay ministers, and ushers will be practicing extreme caution in the care and custody of the Eucharist during these days. Please, be especially attentive to how you receive communion. All should consume the Eucharist directly in front of the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister. Do not step to the side before consuming.

Now that the Triduum and Easter Sunday have passed, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the musicians of the collaborative for their gift of music and hard work that helped us to pray and celebrate the holiest days of the Christian calendar. We are truly

blessed to have such talented singers and players who unceasingly give of their time and talent to enhance our prayer and liturgy.

Many people have told me how much they appreciated the music during the Triduum, that it was powerful in its message and prayerful in its presentation. This was the intention, for the music to communicate the mysterious power and wonder of Christ's passion and resurrection.

Now, our hymnody will be lighter and brighter as we move through the Easter season. This is the Mass setting that we were using before Lent. We will also sing the beautiful Easter Marian Antiphon, *Regina Caeli*, before the final hymn throughout the Easter season until Pentecost.

FOR REFLECTION

In today's gospel we meet the disheartened disciples on the Road to Emmaus, a road out of Jerusalem. Being discouraged at the death of Jesus, they have an encounter with Christ that changed them forever. Jesus met them where they were, listened to them and opened their minds and hearts. He did something familiar, "he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them" and by doing this their eves were opened and they recognized him. Jesus is with us at every Mass in the scripture we hear and in the breaking of the bread - in the Eucharist. Do we recognize him there? Like those early disciples, after receiving Christ in the Eucharist will we say, 'Were not our hearts burning within us...?'" Let us pray for one another that our hearts will "burn within" each time we receive Jesus in Holy Communion.

REFLECTING ON EASTER

Did you know that Easter is the longest – and most important - season in our liturgical year? The Easter season is 50 days – it is a way of prolonging the joy of that initial day. A time when we are meant to experience what it means when we say Christ is Risen. It's during this season that we ponder early Christianity, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, Christ with us in the Eucharist, and the meaning of our discipleship. This 50-day celebration is a taste of the heavenly banquet but out of this celebration, we are called to live Christian life with the resounding cry, Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection: "*If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith.*" (1 Cor 15:14)

Those who track the parish collections, as reported in the bulletin, know that we are lagging behind our goals for weekly collections. Growing facility demands compound this shortfall.

This winter, we replaced the boiler in St. Agnes Church. This was unplanned. Besides costing us a few days of heat in the Church, the project cost approximately \$70,000. We have made improvements to the Church sound system, which includes hearing assist devices. Ushers can provide a unit if you require one (4 are available).

The Bell Tower at St. Camillus has been identified as having damaged bricks. We are working with engineers to see what can be done. The scaffolding, that may be required, is anticipated to cost thousands of dollars. Also at St. Camillus, the lower Church Hall will be painted and new chairs and tables will be purchased; these renovations are estimated to cost \$35,000.


