

FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OBLIGATION TRANSFERRED TO DECEMBER 9

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Dec. 8) is a holy day in the U.S. because it is under this title that the Mother of the Lord is our patroness -- it is now always a holy day of obligation. This year, December 8 is the Second Sunday of Advent, and so has liturgical preference over the Immaculate Conception. Because of the significance of this Marian feast, its observance is moved this year to Monday, Dec. 9, 2024. And, according to a response from the Holy See to an inquiry from the U.S. bishops, the obligation is also transferred. This is a new interpretation of the church's law. So, Dec. 9, 2024, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is now always a holy day of obligation. The Mass Schedule will be as follows:

Saint John Monday, December 9 4:30 PM Saint Theresa Monday, December 9 8:30 A.M. 7:00 P.M.



EVANGELIZATION November 24 Solemnity of Christ the King, King of the Universe

In our gospel today Pilate is questioning Jesus about his kingship. Jesus chooses instead to tell Pilate and us why he came into the world. He came to tell us the truth about God, to witness to the truth - the truth about ourselves, and the truth about life. This last Sunday of the liturgical year calls us to take a truthful inventory on our life of faith. We might start by asking ourselves - if Jesus is the center of our life, how frequently do we pray, or receive Holy Communion, or go to Confession? Do we listen attentively to what we hear in scriptures each week for what God is saying? Are charitable actions an expression of our love of God? It's the end of the year, what will our faith life inventory reveal that needs to be strengthened or changed??


When interrogated by Pilate, Jesus leaves no doubt about His mission. He has come to testify, to give witness to the truth.

What is that truth? The truth is that God loves us so much that He became one of us, dying on the cross to free us from sin. He is the King of all creation and His




FAMILY LIFE:


