FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY




TO WALK AS ONE

parenting seminar at our

parish featured a segment on faith development in children. Time and again, the speaker stressed the importance of the family in teaching children about the meaning and purpose of religious doctrine and practices. If children do not see it at home, they won't see it—or believe it—anywhere else. Religion is taught, but faith is caught.


We cannot overestimate how important a role the family plays in teaching the basics of faith. Children practice what they see. How many two year olds try to make the Sign of the Cross as the family prays before meals? It is comical at times, but a clear reminder that what a child sees and does in the home forms the basis of his or her own practice of faith.

Values, morals, and faith all begin at home, so that what the family teaches,



Make room for faith and time for its practice. In busy schedules, rushed evenings, and overscheduled weekends, we need the time and space to be quiet, to listen, to pray and to worship. 
