LENTEN STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Stations of the Cross will take place in the Main Church Friday evening, April 4 beginning at 7:00 P.M. All are welcome.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE: Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all.

FAST: Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. One these days, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal one full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.





The 4th Sunday of Lent – "Laetare Sunday

The readings for this 4th Sunday of Lent, particularly the parable of the Prodigal Son, highlight God's boundless love and willingness to forgive, even when we stray far from Him

The parable of the Prodigal Son also challenges us to extend forgiveness to others, just as God forgives us. The prodigal son's journey back to his father serves as a powerful reminder that we are all called to return to God, the ultimate source of love and belonging.

The older brother's jealousy and resentment in the parable remind us to be mindful of our own attitudes towards those who have strayed and returned, and to celebrate their return with joy.

The father's unwavering love and compassion for his son, even after his mistakes, is a powerful representation of God's love for us.

The celebration that follows the son's return is a symbol of the joy that comes from reconciliation with God and others.

During our Lenten season, let us seek God's forgiveness for our sins and ask for the grace to forgive others. Let us extend compassion and understanding to those who have made mistakes, just as God has done for us.



April 4, caprese sandwiches, tomato soup and salad April 11, vegetable tacos, vegetable soup and rolls





as there ever been a time when we did not need forgiveness? Haven't we all gotten a little off course—with God, with our family, or with our friends—at one time or another? Isn't there always someone who we should forgive? Here are a few thoughts about forgiveness, inspired by the Prodigal Son and his brother.

- To forgive does not require that we forget. After all, if it were easy to forget, would we need to forgive?
- When you forgive, you free a person who is a prisoner of anger and hate. Then you realize that the person freed is you.
- Ordinary people have offered forgiveness in extraordinary circumstances. We can learn from their courage and example.
- Those who are the most difficult to forgive are often the ones who need it the most.
- Forgiveness brings peace, contentment, hope and calm.



FAMILY LIFE:

TO WALK AS ONE

here is a great scene in the

movie version of Charles
Dickens's "A Christmas
Carol." After his time with the
Christmas spirits, Scrooge goes to the
home of his nephew Fred and
approaches Fred's wife Emily, asking
her, "Can you forgive a pig-headed old
fool with no eyes to see and no ears to
hear all these years?" It is the moment
in the story when Scrooge is reunited
with his family and discovers the
meaning of Christmas he had denied
for so many years.

There is a difference between saying I'm sorry and asking for forgiveness. The first is a moment of conversion when we recognize our sins and turn from them. It is the moment of regret and we acknowledge we are wrong. The second is asking for reconciliation,

something we cannot take for ourselves but which someone must give us.



When we sin, we need to correct our mistakes and make amends for the hurt we have caused. Being sorry for our sin does not guarantee reconciliation, and people may need time to reconcile. But we should ask for forgiveness and let others know we are truly sorry for our offenses. So when my words or actions hurt someone I love, I need to do all I can to repair our relationship, and to restore our love and trust. "Please forgive me" is a powerful step in the right direction.




